If you work in your garage, do you find one or both of them competing for your attention?



I wanted to share a couple pictures of our 1970 Triumph GT6+ and our **rotisserie** that we delivered to our welder 2 weeks ago.



The welder, Brent Ottaway, was recommended to us by someone in BCCW. I think this is his first floor pan job. He is a real nice young man. His shop is just south & east of McConnell AFB runways.

We had to wait 9 months or so for him to get his shop built and mostly finished before we took our stuff to him. We hauled everything in a big box truck that our friend uses in his work.

We had 6 men plus Brett that did the unloading and attachment work. The front of the car is attached directly to our rotisserie; the back of the car has a 2x4 between the body and rotisserie. Rear of car is bolted directly to the 2x4; the board was bolted to the rotisserie.

A Last Tribute to Ruby, Blackwell's 1973 MGB

When she was good, she was very, very good. When she was bad, she was better!

Ruby, my shiny, feisty MGB, always had the power to inspire others to think British MGBs. Here's one such conversation:

Greg Suter & I had been comparing notes on high school car memories....

Greg said, "As a kid, I was the 'light holder' for my father, who worked on the cars we owned because, "I don't trust anyone to get under my hood..." I remember back when we would get gas and they would wash the windshield and 'check under the hood', except that he would NEVER let them check under the hood...he would do any checking, if checking was needed.

I've done my time with brakes, oil changes, dropped a rear end on a corvette and re-assembled & rebuilt an engine, pulled, took to rebuilder, reinstalled in a Subaru. I was gifted as an adolescent from working with my older brother.

I can remember - really well - on a near ZERO DEGREE night in an unheated garage that I was enlisted to help my father replace a starter in his 1972 Chrysler 300 (awesome car, by the way.) That made me swear off working on cars. "I'm going to make enough money so I can pay people to fix my cars; better yet, I'll buy NEW cars that have a warranty." My father laughed, lying underneath the car and said, "Easier said than done...now



hold the light right here...and stop blinding me".

For the most part, I've held true to my pledge...new cars, under warranty...when trouble ensues, take it to someone else to repair or trade away. BUT, I still enjoy CLEANING the cars, polishing chrome, windows, etc., just so you know I'm not a lost cause. For some reason, the romance of having an old MG - inspired largely by you and your stories of rebuilding something non-stop and seeing you tool around in your shiny MG - has prompted me to be drawn into this endeavor on this little red 1964 MGB Pull handle!

(The 1964 Red MGB Pull Handle Greg referred to was a nice car in an auction in California that he was bidding on at that time when we chatted. Sadly, that MG was withdrawn from the auction.

Greg hasn't given up on finding a Little British MGB!)
