Y'all come next time, Heah?









(A slow-motion film of action would have moved about as fast as a the still photo study shown below.)



We were forntunate to snag a break in the rain to get the MGB Beast on the trailer. We got it to and into Hank's garge without rearranging any of its body lines or mirrors.

We poked ang prodded and "laid hands on" as many parts as we could reach to check for any obviousleaks or disconnects and checked the floor for any dreaded signs of age-related leaks (because Depends don't come in this car size.) places like Ogunquit, Maine, a FREE beach. You can walk miles on






the beach with the incoming tide and VERY attentive sea

Squaniscook Hook & Ladder Company is a very stately Fire Station that makes you glad you have your camera! Ancient structures like this hide everywhere.


In MA, the apple trees were much heavier with larger fruit than usual, and were ready for the seasonal help to descend on the orchards to pick ship.
