IN THE REAR VIEW MIRROR



JANUARY was bitter cold & snowy, but there's good news out of Hank's garage.

THERE'S LIGHT AT THE END OF THE TUNNEL!

After 3? 4? years, work on the Midget has reached the point of headlight socket assembly & installation! The



Hank & Rod & Dan & Bob Team Wins! With the twin LED torches lit up, the Midget looks much more like a racecar now. Burning all that garage propane this winter has put them so far ahead, they can actually see the Finish Line!

Two days prior, the front fenders got "the treatment"...flares to match the rears.

First, a check fit of each fender prior to drilling fastener holes for the flare mounts. During fender fit, Rod saw that the inside fender edge was going to encroach on the relay and block access for replacement.





The fender was pulled back off and both the relay and wiring was repositioned. The relay was now accessible.
That's the magic of "Check Fit."

Geometry reared its ugly head: had fenders grown or twisted? Hank already expected that. "A Midget that had been riding

for that long on the road and been bent, bashed, & beat up will probably have some problems fitting together."

It did! The front mounts were shy 1/2" until Hank did his adjusting while Rod & I kept holes aligned for bolts.





Next, the bottom rear corner refused to fit to allow the proper spacing of design gaps in seams up the side & across the bottom. As before, persistence and firm "negotiation" works!

With fenders fitted.

the hood cut out will be next.

Yes, the hood has cosmetics coming, but It's a fault of the engine....it's too BIG. JUST LOOK AT IT!



Distributor sticks up in the air! Valve cover bumps up through the middle!



Horns of the carburettors look like they're better suited to be cannon nested in the gunnels of a battleship! Making a hole in the hood: an undertaking (not good pun) that's a big change. You gotta be pretty confident about cuts in your one-and-only

hood. The engineer in Rod & Hank designed a paper pattern. First, a rough cardboard cutout allowed trim corrections to tame down the risk of hole locations for the engine and the radiator. Next, call Blackwell to bring over his pointy little knives & straight edges. Lots of measuring trimming & pasting-back ensued. Then, it was off to Hobby Lobby for 1/4" foam core sheet and have me carve it up with X-acto knives and (maybe) a steady hand. A closely fitted & carved template lying comfortably on the engine is a big relief. With fenders mounted and flares installed,

light sockets were fabricated; LED head-



lights & LED signals were installed. It all lit up perfectly the first time. The MG decorations were added to the trunk.



These 2 sets of chrome identification sets promise to invite questions wherever the Midget gets some public exposure!

Where does **Midget** end & **Sprite** begin? Good conversation starter, Hank!

The doors got their handles installed, but the door locks became a roadblock:



mechanism refused to work first time. Just a new puzzle with tiny pieces inside. Rod dismantled lock and figured out what does what. Found a tiny pin inside and **BINGO!** turn lock from an **MGB** into an **MGA lock** correct for the door.

The hood and template await a shower of sparks from Hank's cutting wheel.

The 1964 MGB "Coune" Berlinetta












This unique Belgian-built coupe brought a record price in its home country (Coachwork by Carrosserie Jacques Coune, Chassis No. G-HN3-L/23830, Sold for 120,750 #)

In 1962, Jacques Coune established his own coachbuilding firm to create body styles that were not offered in the ranges of various manufacturers. This was particularly true of the MGB, which was only available as a roadster when Coune began producing his MGB Berlinetta. He







producing his **MGB Berlinetta**. He produced 56 examples, one of the first being presented at the **Brussels Motor**

Show in January 1964, just ahead of the factory's own **MGB GT** coupe, which arrived the following year.

This early example (Berlinetta) left the MG factory on November 1, 1963, likely delivered to Ets P. Decrose in Brussels as a standard left-hand-drive roadster finished in British Racing Green with black interior and matching soft top. Being one of the first produced by Coune, it is one of just six examples to feature the all-steel "Jacques Coune" body. The car was first registered on June 25, 1964, with its first owner, and in 1967 was registered in Luxembourg to Dieter Pfeilstucker in Esh-sur-Alzette. The various photocopies of documents accompanying the car reveal that it was exported in the Netherlands in 1989 and sold in 1998 by E. Banhart to Guy Kaido. The current owner, a prominent Belgian collector, bought the rare MGB **Coune** in 2008.

In 2006, the body was fully restored by Carrozzeria GranTurismo in Milan, while in 2009-10 another professional restoration was carried out by Classic Car Service Restorations in Antwerp, Belgium. The car is currently fitted with an upgraded engine with a performance-enhancing cross-flow cylinder head, and its original 1.8-liter engine (engine no.18GUH24205) and gearbox, stored in a crate, will be delivered with the car.

Rare Car, Record Sale

Chassis GHN3L23830 is one of Coune's initial six all-steel versions. Several upgrades are apparent in the engine bay, including an aluminum cross-flow head, with twin Webers added to the factory B-series 1,798 cc 4-cylinder engine. Other modifications include an oversized radiator with an electric fan, a tidy aluminum catch tank

and a brake booster. The original engine and gearbox accompany the car, as well as a British Motor Industry Heritage Trust Certificate and documentation, verifying our subject car's restoration & ownership.

The crinkle-painted metal dash and toggle switches are hallmarks of any early MGB. The gearshift knob suggests that this transmission is a 5-speed Manual, while the original would have been a 4-speed, with no first-gear syncro. Slight wrinkling in the rear upholstery around the wheel arches does not detract from the attractive presentation.

The car left the factory in **British Racing Green with round taillights specified by Coune. Borrani wire wheels** complement the car's overall demeanor.

Scarce sales: one in **England** was renovated into a race car with an asking price of **\$85K**. A recently restored example in **France** was offered at **\$120K**.

Meanwhile, the highest sale price for an MGB of any type in SCM's Platinum Auction Database is a 1962 factory light-weight MGB that finished 4Th in its class at Sebring, selling at \$105K 'way back in 2004 (SCM # 34816.) Given this land-scape, the result achieved at Bonhams Car's Belgian Auction was in the seller's favor, benchmarking what might be a new record price at auction for any MGB variant.





Tata Motors – Founded 1945

Tata is an Indian brand and part of the wider Tata conglomerate.

Between 1954 and 1969, the brand enjoyed a collaboration with Daimler-Benz. Jaguar Land Rover (JLR) was later purchased from Ford in 2008.

Land Rover - Founded 1948

Land Rover was acquired by Tata Motors in 2008, but is still revered as a British icon. Range Rover, in the meantime, has long been established (since 1970) as the brand's flagship model range.

Jaguar - Founded 1922

Jaguar is a British luxury car brand previously controlled by Ford, from 1989 until 2008 Under Ford's ownership, the brand never made a profit. In the wake of this failure and the Global Financial Crisis, Ford opted to sell it, along with Land Rover, to its current owner. Tata.

Both brands under the JLR umbrella have enjoyed a resurgence since Tata's acquisition, with an explosion of new models and variants – as well as significant manufacturing investment including the Ingenium engine plant in the UK.



SAIC Motor – Founded 1955

Formerly known as the Shanghai Automotive Industry Corporation, SAIC is one of the big-four state-owned carmakers in China and is the country's largest by volume, producing more than 5.81 million cars in 2021.

In 2008, Tata Motors acquired Jaguar Land Rover (JLR) for \$2.3 billion.

•JLR brands, including Jaguar, Land Rover, Range Rover, and Defender, are known for their unique design and rich heritage.

 Tata Motors also has a luxury sub-brand called Avinya, which is positioned below JLR products.

Its initial growth was due to a surge in demand for cars in China during the 1980s, which saw it enter a joint venture agreement with Volkswagen and another with General Motors in 1998. Both partnerships are still in place today with SAIC producing Cadillac, Chevrolet, Buick, Volkswagen Skoda and Audi badged vehicles. It is also the parent company of MG Motor, Roewe, and Maxus, which trades in Australia as LDV.
